that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence," 1 Peter 3:15.

Don't be all mouth and no ears. "A fool does not delight in understanding, but only in revealing his own mind," Proverbs 18:2.

Use your ears before your mouth. "He who gives an answer before he hears, it is folly and shame to him," Proverbs 18:13.

Have quick ears, a slow mouth, and a long fuse. "Be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger," James 1:19.

Think before you speak. "The heart of the righteous ponders how to answer," Proverbs 15:28.

Don't argue. "The beginning of strife is like letting out water, so abandon the quarrel before it breaks out,"

Proverbs 17:14.

Be clever, discerning, and wise ... but not sinful. Jesus said, "Be shrewd as serpents and innocent as doves," Matthew 10:16.

Be a salve not a sword. "There is one who speaks rashly like the thrusts of a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing," Proverbs 12:18.

Be persuasive. "The tongue of the wise makes knowledge acceptable,"

Proverbs 15:2.

Give good answers. "A man has joy in an apt answer ... He kisses the lips who gives a right answer," Proverbs 15:23 & 24:26.

Remember, you aren't trying to drive anyone to Jesus or argue anybody to Jesus.
You are trying to gently, and convincingly
persuade them to believe in Jesus.
